To name one of the many exciting initiatives running, at the end of the Spring term 105 students across KS3 and KS4 took part in a leadership training programme delivered by the SSAT. Students from Year 7, 8 and 9 completed a range of activities that focussed on their position within the Student council and were introduced to the concept of leadership at KS3. 45 Year 10 students that had recently applied and been appointed as either English/Maths learning mentors, Reading leaders and Peer mediators, spent time with the SSAT trainers discussing and implementing coaching techniques as peer mentors, and explored a range of leadership styles to further develop them as KS4 leaders, ensuring that as a leader they are able to tackle their role with confidence, whilst developing their planning, organisational and communication skills.

The company delivering the session were captivated by the level of creativity, critical thinking and focus in the room and the feedback form the students was really positive.

Student Voice Advocates have also been selected this year. The purpose of creating a student voice team of 40 students from Year 7 to Year 10 is to capture the viewpoints, feelings and thoughts of our students on their day-to-day life in school. We want to gauge opinions on our routines, and use the information we receive as a base for change. The selected students have really enjoyed the experience so far, stating they have felt listened to and are already seeing the changes made as a direct result of their opinions. Finally, the Year 11 Leadership applications have been shortlisted this week and by the time you read this, the interviews will have taken place and our newly appointed Year 11 Leadership team will be in position. Becoming a member of Great Academy Ashton's Year 11 Student Leadership Team is a privileged position that allows students to be play a key role in our unique community and uphold the ethos and values of the school. The Head Students in particular hold a prestigious position as the voice of all students and will play a crucial role in school and public events, promoting the ethos and inspiring GREATness.
